Texas Stone Fruit Testing Program 2019

The Texas A&M University Stone Fruit Breeding and Genetics program has recently released several series of medium to low chill peach and nectarine cultivars. These include the following series:

- 1. <u>Zest peach series</u>, this includes *Fire Zest One*, the Royal Zest peach series (4 cultivars) and Golden Zest. These medium-chill peaches have a traditional tart sweet flavor. *Fire Zest One* ripens in early May whereas the Royal Zest series ripens from late May until late June. The Golden Zest peach is a yellow peach with a slight red blush.
- 2. <u>White Zest One</u>. This is a medium-chill white-fleshed peach with a traditional tart sweet flavor. This productive peach ripens in early June.
- 3. White Delight peach series. These four white-fleshed peaches are reminiscent of Georgia Belle but with better appearance, firmness, and adapted to our Texas environment. These subacid peaches have a wonderful sweet peach flavor and ripen from late May until late June or early July.
- 4. Royal Delight peach series to be released. This is a series of delightfully sweet yellow-fleshed peaches with a chilling requirement ranging from 200 to 550 chill hours and ripening from early May until mid-June.
- 5. <u>Smooth Texan nectarine</u> series. Three yellow-fleshed, medium-chill nectarines that ripen from mid-May until early June.
- 6. <u>Smooth Zest nectarines</u>. White-fleshed and yellow-fleshed pair of low-chill nectarines with a tangy sweet flavor that ripen in mid-May.
- 7. <u>Smooth Delight nectarines</u>. White-fleshed and yellow-fleshed pair of low-chill nectarines and a medium-chill white-fleshed nectarine with superb sweet flavor that ripen in mid- to late May.
- 8. Flat Delight peaches. This is a pair of deliciously sweet medium-chill flat or donut peaches.
- 9. <u>Tropical peaches</u>. This includes the Tropic Zest series, Tropicprince and TexFirst. These are low-chill yellow-fleshed peaches that ripen from early May to mid-June.

The Stone Fruit Testing Program is designed to allow growers to obtain a few trees of many of these selections for trial on their own farms. Thus, orders for sets of trees from individuals will be taken through May 15, 2019. Budwood of the ordered trees will be collected and sent to Burchell Nursery in California. The trees will be available for planting in February of 2020. A minimum of two trees and a maximum of ten trees of each cultivar can be ordered for testing. The cost per tree is \$8.50. Payment for trees is due when orders are placed. *Please use the order form PDF to place orders*. 
